COURSE DESCRIPTION:

“How American Soccer Fans Are Smarter Than Average Americans”. This is the title of a 2013 article claiming that American soccer supporters have a greater sense of global awareness—manifesting through things such as geographic and time zone knowledge, pronunciation of international cities and non-English names, and more—than the typical American. What is it about this fandom that makes this so? This course will examine the influence sports have on our culture--looking at topics including race, religion, nationality, gender, politics and more. We'll look at amateur, college, and professional sports in the US and abroad. We will consider how professional athletes use their status to guide national and international discussions and how these discussions then impact our own lives. Specifically, we will explore how sport influences intercultural awareness, as the field/court/pitch is often where we see diverse individuals coming together for a common goal.

LEARNING OUTCOMES:

Upon course completion, a student will be able to:

- Articulate and explain the major issues associated with gender, social class, race, and media, in sports.
- Think critically and articulate how sports impact society as well as how society impacts sports, using disciplinary lenses including politics, education, sociology, communications, and more.
- Demonstrate ability to select and utilize appropriate communication styles and techniques for diverse contexts and purposes, including written and oral communication.

Let's define culture as: the beliefs, values, perspectives, and practices of a group of people. This includes the behavior pattern, and norms of this group—these include the rules, forms of communication, assumptions, and the logic and reasoning that are specific to the group.

In this, the first such assignment, you will identify and analyze an instance of sport influencing your culture. So, think about the groups you connect to with shared beliefs, perspectives, etc. This could be the culture of your home state or country, your ethnicity, your religion, your political party, your generation, etc.

Then, think of an instance where sport has impacted that group or aspect of your culture. In the paper, include a summary of what actually happened—assume I have no idea so be sure to include detail. This summary should take maybe ½ a page. The remainder of your paper should talk about the aspect of culture you're covering and show how it changed because of what happened in your chosen sport.

This paper must meet the following guidelines:

- 12 point font, Times or Cambria
- **3-4 pages in length**, 1 inch margins
- Include at least **4 sources** cited properly using APA format. More on APA format can be found at: <https://apastyle.apa.org/style-grammar-guidelines/references>

How has sport influenced WVU culture?

As we progress through this course you will complete several assignments that demonstrate your ability to both identify aspects of human culture and to relate them to things we see in sport.

Let's define culture as: the beliefs, values, perspectives, and practices of a group of people. This includes the behavior pattern, and norms of this group—these include the rules, forms of communication, assumptions, and the logic and reasoning that are specific to the group.

In this assignment you will identify and analyze an instance of sport influencing West Virginia University culture. Begin by trying to define or identify WVU culture. What is it that makes WVU, WVU? Is it the majors we have, the places our students come from, is it the community spirit, is it a particular restaurant or bar, etc.?

Then, think of an instance where sport has impacted our school. This can include things like the Backyard Brawl, athletic scholarships, conference memberships, etc. And the impact doesn't have to be positive!

In the paper, include a summary of what actually happened—assume I have no idea so be sure to include detail. This summary should take maybe ½ a page. The remainder of your paper should talk about the aspect of culture you're covering and show how it changed because of what happened in your chosen sport. This section should be more in depth than in the first culture impact paper—we're deeper into the semester now so I'm assuming you're even more skilled at viewing sport through a cultural lens now. It might be useful to go back and look at your feedback on the first paper to see what you should focus on improving or expanding here.

An obvious example of sport impacting WVU culture could be how WVU had a period where it was known more for couch burning after games than anything else. How did this impact WVU? The administration responded to this—what did that change?

As we progress through this course you will complete several assignments that demonstrate your ability to both identify aspects of human culture and to relate them to things we see in sport.

Let's define culture as: the beliefs, values, perspectives, and practices of a group of people. This includes the behavior pattern, and norms of this group—these include the rules, forms of communication, assumptions, and the logic and reasoning that are specific to the group.

In this assignment you will identify and analyze an instance of sport influencing a culture other than your own. Begin by trying to define or identify this new culture. What are the defining features? Tell us about the people in this culture—what shapes them?

Then, think of an instance where sport has impacted that culture. This can range widely—I am open to you doing the research to convince me of the impact. Be sure to use your sources here to support this!

In the paper, include a summary of what actually happened—assume I have no idea so be sure to include detail. This summary should take maybe ½ a page. The remainder of your paper should talk about the aspect of culture you're covering and show how it changed because of what happened in your chosen sport. This section should be more in depth than in the first culture impact paper—we're deeper into the semester now so I'm assuming you're even more skilled at viewing sport through a cultural lens now. It might be useful to go back and look at your feedback on the first paper to see what you should focus on improving or expanding here.

If you think back through the semester various discussion board assignments have provided examples of this. For instance, think back to cricket and the cultures of India and Pakistan.
